**SAN DIEGO FUTURES FOUNDATION RECEIVES  
\$20,000 DONATION FROM AT&T**

***-- "Extreme Technology Makeover program" is launched --***

San Diego, CA – June 20, 2007 - The San Diego Futures Foundation (SDFF) a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization, recently received a \$20,000 grant from AT&T's Excelerator Fund to support technology services for nonprofits. With this generous donation, SDFF is launching their "Extreme Technology Makeover" program sponsored by AT&T, which will offer free technical services and upgrades to select San Diego nonprofits. The makeover may include technical services, computers, software, planning and consulting at no cost to them.

SDFF's objective is to provide "extreme" makeovers to three or more nonprofit organizations with critical technical issues, which ultimately impacts their ability to provide services. To qualify, an agency must be a 501c3 nonprofit organization that serves San Diego County. Questions to be asked of each nonprofit applicant include:

1. What are your current technology challenges?
2. How do your technology issues prevent you from doing your work?
3. How would better technology improve your ability to serve your clients?
4. What is the extent of your technology need (desktops, servers, software, networking, cabling, etc)?
5. Do you have a technology plan and budget?

“Our goal is to work with nonprofits to improve their efficiency, enabling them to more effectively serve their clients,” said Ignacio De La Torre, Regional Vice President for AT&T. “Through this program, many nonprofits will reap the immediate benefits of improved technology infrastructure and training, but the ultimate benefactors will be the individuals who rely on these organizations for support.”

Chartered to make information technology available to the broadest range of San Diego County residents through the delivery of hardware, software, communications, training and education, the San Diego Futures Foundation is enabling a broader range of citizens to access technology resources.
