\$125,000 DONATION
FROM NORTHROP GRUMMAN CORPORATION

San Diego, CA – May 2, 2007 -- The San Diego Futures Foundation (SDFF) a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization, recently received a first quarter cash donation of \$125,000 from Northrop Grumman Corporation, which will total \$500,000 in 2007.
